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## Gospel Reflection



The Gospel that we heard in church last Sunday reminded us to have faith in the power of God and His perfect timing. Jairus asked Jesus to heal his very sick daughter but, as Jesus was on his way to heal her, a woman, who had suffered from bleeding for many years, touched his cloak. He was delayed in his haste to get to Jairus's daughter because he stopped to find out who had touched his cloak and been healed. The woman had ultimate faith in Jesus' healing power and that was why she was saved. Jairus must have wondered why Jesus would stop when he was in such a hurry, but we must remember that there are no mistakes in God's plan. Any delay would have been planned for a reason, perhaps so Jairus could hear of the woman's faith, which would have strengthened his faith in Jesus' healing power and ability to heal his daughter. The delay meant that the child died before Jesus' arrival, but He raised her from death.

Sometime we might question God's plan and wonder why He has caused certain things to happen in our lives, but we must have faith that he knows the bigger picture. Like in this story, interruptions and delays are part of his perfect timing.

### Uniform from September 2021: Summary of Changes

We are moving to a new uniform provider for the new academic year: School Days Direct. We will issue you with further information regarding this and will publish this information on our website.

School Days Direct have a shop on the Slough Trading Estate and offer a Click and Collect Service, as well as delivery to your home and to school.

We are changing our uniform slightly to give it a fresh look; jumpers and cardigans will have a yellow stripe, the tie diagonal stripe will be slightly different and Year Six will have a sew-on badge for their blazer.

For PE, to make sourcing tracksuits easier and cheaper for families, we will be moving to black tracksuit tops and bottoms. You do not need to replace blue tracksuits that you have, we will be phasing these out over time. From September leggings will not be permitted as part of the PE kit. The coloured PE tops remain unchanged.

Nursery will wear uniform in line with the rest of the school and will wear a tracksuit for PE only. Instead of a shirt and tie, nursery children will wear a polo shirt and school cardigan or jumper.

### **Government Guidance**

We are continuing to monitor the Government recommendations in relation to social distancing, mask wearing and bubbles. We will re-evaluate our risk assessment over the coming weeks and will communicate with you about the coming half term. For now, we will continue with our current systems. Please ensure that your child is arriving on time for their learning; if children are late for school, they miss vital early morning learning in their core subjects. Thank you for your continued support to ensure that your child arrives for school on time.

### **Birthday cakes**

We have made the decision to allow **prepacked cakes only**, to be brought in to school for birthdays this term.

### **After school clubs**

There are still places available on some of our new after school clubs. Please login to ParentPay to sign your child up. These clubs are free and we would encourage children to attend.

### **After School Clubs from September 2021**

We are working hard to offer a wide range of after school activities for your children from September 2021. We will be in touch over the next week to inform you of the club arrangements so that you can start to book, ready for September!

### **Illness**

If your child is unwell and will not be attending school, please call this office after 8.30 am, select option 1 as specified, and leave a message stating the child's name, class and reason for absence, for example temperature, sickness, sore throat. Any child with vomiting or diarrhoea will need to be 48 hours clear of the last episode before they return to school.

### **RAPID COVID-19 TESTS NOW AVAILABLE FOR HOUSEHOLDS WITH CHILDREN OF SCHOOL AGE**

Whole families and households with primary school, secondary school and college age children, including childcare and support bubbles, are now able to test themselves twice every week from home.

Rapid testing detects cases quickly – in under 30 minutes – meaning positive cases can isolate immediately. This can be the difference between children being able to stay in school, or a class being sent home due to an outbreak. It could also be the difference between a workplace having to close for a period, or being able to stay open and running.

How do I get home testing kits?

There are 3 different options on how you and your household can get tested: 1. Order kits to test your household by visiting <https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests> 2. Find a local site to get tested at by visiting <https://maps.test-and-trace.nhs.uk/find-covid-19-rapid-test-sites> and entering your postcode to find your nearest testing site 3. Find a local site where you can collect tests by visiting <https://find-covid-19-rapid-test-sites.maps.test-and-trace.nhs.uk/> and entering your postcode to find your nearest collection site.

Please do not contact the school for home testing kits as they are only available by these 3 options. We do not hold any testing kits on school premises for our families.

Please park in the church car park if you are dropping off by car; it is incredibly dangerous to park along the Farnham Road and could cause an accident.
