In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus warns us of all that will undoubtedly occur in our lives (either directly or indirectly) and how such things will affect our faith. He speaks of war, persecution, hatred and judgement. The Gospel tells us 'do not be frightened... your endurance will win you your lives'. In the face of adversity we must stand tall. When we see violence, hatred, disruption, corruption, suffering, disease, malice, racism, crime... we must pray! Our faith is stronger than we think it is; our God is stronger than we think He is!

In our worship today we are encouraging the children to persevere in faith - to pray, to fight with faith and place our despair at the state of the world into God's hands, and in turn, become witnesses of how faith can endure all.

As we start a new week at St. Anthony's, let us be ever-reminded of the importance of our faith and the power of prayer.



This Week:

This week Year 5 went on a very exciting school trip to Hampton Court Palace. Hampton Court is in Richmond and was one of the homes of King Henry VIII. The children have been learning all about the Tudors and this period of History so it was great for them to experience it hands on through workshops.









Our Year 6 children have been learning about Franz Ferdinand. He was the heir presumptive to the throne of Austria-Hungary. His assassination in Sarajevo precipitated Austria-Hungary's declaration of war against Serbia, which in turn triggered a series of events that eventually led to Austria-Hungary's allies and Serbia's declaring war on each other, starting World War I. They have been using London Tube inspired editing stations to edit their newspaper articles all about this period of History.

Please make sure that all uniform worn and brought into school is clearly labelled with your child's full name. The lost property bunkers are getting full again. Thank you.


Cake sale


There is a deadline for applying for your 30 hours code via the website.
