In Sunday's Gospel Jesus revisits a few of the 10 Commandments. We are reminded of the importance of having God's law and intention for our lives at the forefront of our minds and indeed, allowing them to influence our decisions, actions, morals and values as Christians. It is no coincidence that this Gospel will be heard with only 10 days to go before we begin the season of Lent. This Sunday, along with the next prepares us for the journey we will embark upon; for the time of preparation that we solemnly begin on Ash Wednesday.

In our worship today we remind the children 'love our enemies and pray for those who persecute us'. This command, hand in hand with each of those we heard on Sunday are not words or actions beyond our limit or capability. They are ways in which, if we have the courage to hear them, obey them and put them into action, will help shape us to be humble, holy, selfless, loving people; to be the people we were created to be.



This Week:

Welcome back to all our lovely children. It was great to see so many smiling faces this morning despite the horrible weather over the half term. Lots of children got up to some exciting things and these were shared throughout the day. The weather is due to get colder so please make sure that the children have coats because if it is not raining they will be outside running around! As tomorrow is Shrove Tuesday lots of the children will be taking part in exciting activities involving pancakes! We will be talking about and preparing for Lent through our Ash Wednesday services and really reflecting on the meaning of this time in the Church's calendar.





On this day in 1208 AD, Saint Francis of Assisi received his vocation in Portiuncula, Italy . One morning Francis was hearing Mass in the chapel of St. Mary of the Angels, near which he had then built himself a hut. The Gospel of the day was the "Commissioning of the Twelve" from the Book of Matthew. Francis was inspired to devote himself to a life of poverty. Having obtained a coarse woollen tunic, the dress then worn by the poorest Umbrian peasants, he tied it around him with a knotted rope and went forth at once exhorting the people of the countryside to penance brotherly love, and peace. Francis' preaching to ordinary people was unusual since he had no license to do so.

Free School Meals

Help your school and yourself - claim free school meals

Taking up free school meals has benefits for everyone:

- · children get a healthy nutritious meal
- · schools can benefit directly by receiving £1300 for each eligible primary school child

WHO QUALIFIES FOR FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Free school meals are offered to children of families who receive:

- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseeker Allowance (IBJSA)
- 2 Employment & Support Allowance (Income Related) (ESA(RI))
- I Support under part V1 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit (TC602) that does not exceed income of £16190.00
- 2 Guarantee element of State Pension Credit (M1000 Award Notice)
- 2 Universal Credit and my family's net income excluding any benefit related payments is less than £7,400

HOW TO APPLY FOR FREE SCHOOL MEALS?

If you think you qualify for free school meals and have an email address or mobile number then you can apply through Slough Borough Council's online free school meals form. Slough Borough Council will then inform you if your application is successful or not.

If you do not have an email address or a mobile number then you can get a 'free school meals' application form from your child's/children's school. The school will then inform you if your application is successful or not.

Once you are eligible for free school meals, you are more likely to remain eligible for up to 2 years despite any changes to your circumstances.

Not claiming benefits, but have a child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2?

There are clear advantages in pupils having a school dinner, so the Government have announced that every child in the above Year groups will be eligible for a free meal under the Universal Free School Meals scheme.

You can apply online or pick up a registration form from our school reception.
