This Sunday, we celebrated the feast of 'Christ the Universal King'. We ended our liturgical year with this celebration to remind us of the wonder and royalty of Jesus before we begin to reflect on His birth through Advent. In the Gospel, we hear the thief on the cross next to Jesus asking Him to be remembered; in other words, to forgive Him and make Him worthy to enter the Kingdom of God. Jesus' instant reaction is one of love and mercy. He simply says: 'Today, you will be with me in paradise'. What a comfort these words must have been to the thief; and they should be a comfort to us too.

In our worship today we are helping the children to see that although the image of the Cross is filled with pain and suffering, it is also painted with hope and the selfless service that Jesus lived for. He came to this world to serve, not to be served, and we are reminded of this every time we look at the Cross.

As we start a new week at St. Anthony's, let us be ever-reminded of the importance of our faith and selfless service.



This Week:

This week has been very busy at St. Anthony's. Our Year 3 children went on a school trip to London to visit the National Gallery. The children were taken around in groups by a guide and given a special tour and insight into some of the amazing paintings and artists that are on show there. Everyone was very excited when they got back and the teachers looked very tired! Our Year 5/6 boys played a football match this week after school against St. Ethelbert's. They showed true resilience and determination as they brought the score back up to 3-2 after being behind at half-time.

30 Hours Funded Places for Nursery

From January 2020 we are looking to offer full-day nursery in our setting. Please register your interest by completing a form at the main school office as soon as possible.

If you are unsure if you are eligible, please visit the Childcare Choices website, which is a government website that will explain your options.

If you require any further information, please speak to the EYFS team.

There is a deadline for applying for your 30 hours code via the website.

We are also looking to offer extended sessions for those that may not be entitled to 30 hour funding. Please also let us know if this is of interest to you.

Free School Meals

Help your school and yourself - claim free school meals

Taking up free school meals has benefits for everyone:

- · children get a healthy nutritious meal
- · schools can benefit directly by receiving £1300 for each eligible primary school child

WHO QUALIFIES FOR FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Free school meals are offered to children of families who receive:

- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseeker Allowance (IBJSA)
- Employment & Support Allowance (Income Related) (ESA(RI))
- 2 Support under part V1 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- ☑ Child Tax Credit (TC602) that does not exceed income of £16190.00.
- ☑ Guarantee element of State Pension Credit (M1000 Award Notice)

HOW TO APPLY FOR FREE SCHOOL MEALS?

If you think you qualify for free school meals and have an email address or mobile number then you can apply through Slough Boroughs Councils online free school meals form. Slough Borough Council will then inform you if your application is successful or not.


If you do not have an email address or a mobile number then you can get a 'free school meals' application form from your child's/children's school. The school will then inform you if your application is successful or not.

Once you are eligible for free school meals, you are more likely to remain eligible for up to 2 years despite any changes to your circumstances.

Not claiming benefits, but have a child in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2?

There are clear advantages in pupils having a school dinner, so the Government have announced that every child in the above year groups will be eligible for a free meal under the Universal Free School Meals scheme.

You can apply online or pick up a registration form from our school reception.
